Recipe this month is **SAVORY KALE SCONES** with pumpkin and cheese. They didn't last long!

INGREDIENTS:

2 cups kale leaves, loosely packed
2 cups unbleached flour 1/2 tsp salt
1 tsp baking soda 1/2 tsp baking powder
1 Tbsp sugar 1/3 cup cold butter
1 egg 3/4 cup buttermilk
1/2 cup cooked squash in small dice
3/4 cup grated cheddar cheese
METHOD:

Blend flour, salt, baking powder, baking soda and sugar together and cut in

butter with a pastry blender. In a small bowl beat the egg and buttermilk and add to dry ingre-

dients, mixing just enough to combine Drop by spoonful onto parchment lined cookie sheet.

Bake for 20 minutes until lightly browned.




