



Greetings from the Cookie Cutters

Pumpkin Struesel Muffins

Ingredients:

- 2 cups flour
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1 tablespoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 1/4 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/8 teaspoon ground cloves





- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 large egg, beaten
- 1/3 cup cooking oil
- 1 cup canned pumpkin, no spice
- 2/3 cup milk

Struesel topping

- 1 tablespoon butter
- 1/4 cup brown sugar, packed
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon, ground
- 1/4 cup finely chopped walnuts, or pecans

Method:

- 1. Combine first 8 (dry) ingredients in a large bowl. Make a well in the center.
- 2. Beat egg, cooking oil, pumpkin and milk together in medium bowl and pour into well. Stir until just moistened.
- 3. Fill 12 greased muffin cups about 3/4 full.
- 4. Streusel topping Melt butter in small saucepan. Stir in sugar, cinnamon and walnuts. Divide and sprinkle over each muffin.
- 5. Bake at 400°F for about 18 minutes. Let stand in pan for 5 minutes before removing muffins to wire rack to cool. Dig in!
